It even has a tiny manual zoom head, and bounces vertically. This 270EX flash only works in ETTL and ETTL II modes. If you try to take a picture a few minutes later, you often have to wait a couple of seconds for the flash to recharge. This can lose pictures, since you try to take the picture, and the flash is not yet ready. Each Canon flash goes to sleep after 90 seconds, so by ten minutes I mean

that the flashes have been in standby mode for 8.5 minutes. Ive lost guite a few photos because the 270EX doesn't stay charged very long after it goes into standby mode. Sadly, the 270EX is styled to look like there is an illuminator below the flash tube, but it doesnt have one. It almost looks like there was going to be one, and then it got taken out before the design process was complete. With my 5D Mark II, I couldnt find a menu option to rectify this defect. Other flashes take less than a second to be ready after 10 minutes, or hours. I still lose shots because I expect the flash to be ready instantly after the camera has been idle, which it usually is with the older 220EX. It works great; I never had it come out. Even its little battery door inspires more confidence than the flimsier build of the 220EX. It costs you nothing, and is this sites, and thus my familys, biggest source of support. The 270EX is a very short flash but it is shifted forward to give it lens clearing ability. Height also helps reduce the redeve effect. More power is better as the flash can adjust to lower power when full power is not required, but more than full power is never available. The 270EX has the same guide number at 28mm as the 220EX has at this focal length coverage no change there. Listed focal lengths are for a full frame body. A 17mm focal length setting on a lens mounted to a 1.6x DSLR such as the Corners become darkened when using lenses wider than the angle of coverage. Longer focal lengths can of course be used with any of these flashes, but light falling outside of the framed image will usually be wasted. Its larger and more versatile than the wimpy, builtin camera flashes. Its smaller and a whole lot cheaper than the fullsized, detachable Speedlite flashes like the Canon Speedlite 580EX II or the Speedlite 600EXRT. It is very light and can fit in the palm of your hand. It is one of those cantlivewithoutit Canon camera accessories for me personally. The short video on the Speedlite 270EX II shows what comes in the box and how small it is compared to the Canon Speedlite 580EX. That means at the normal setting if your camera lens is set at f2, the flash would be good up to 36 feet. This speedlite takes two AAsize alkaline batteries as its power source. Its just as easy to take a test shot by using your camera. This way you can also look at your cameras LCD screen to better analyze your lighting results. My Canon 5D Mark III has a MultiFunction button which acts as a test button. Critics of the 270EX II point out that it has no swivel feature. If this is a feature you are going to want, then dont buy it of course. Look at the Canon Speedlite 430EX II instead. Ive use both of them, depending on the shooting situation Im in.

The 270EX II is a real good choice if you just want to use some fill flash to light up your subjects faces a bit, particularly with outdoor photography, backlighting and shadows. For me personally, I just love the size. I occasionally use it on top of my Canon 5D Mark III which has no builtin flash capabilities. Ive never been a fan of direct flashoncamera photographs of people because I am a portrait photographer by trade. I dont like the harsh look of oncamera flash. Not only do you get less flattering portrait lighting, but you also can also get distracting harsh shadows on your background as well. Not only do we eliminate the shadow on the wall, we also have a less contrasty, softer, more pleasing portrait lighting in the photo on the right. Heck, even the shirt looks a whole lot better. Being a camera geek, I also did some Macro Photography with my Speedlite 270EX II. I chose the inside of a red pepper as the subject. I was pleased with the results using the simplest lighting I could and got some pretty cool photos. I also decided to challenge myself and create a few Canon Speedlite Portraits with Molly the Mannequin in my dark basement using the 270EX II as the only light source. Another feature of the Speedlite 270EX II is Auto Power Off after 90 seconds of idle time. It also has an AFAssist Beam. In dark conditions the 270EX II may prefire repeatedly to help your camera focus. The Modeling Flash is a feature that allows you fire the flash to view its lighting effect on your subject. This is triggered by your cameras depth of field preview button. If you are photography geek like me I am not sure how important this is to you or what the practical uses might be, but sometimes its just a lot of fun to play around. There are also cheaper, economypriced diffusers available for Canon Speedlites, but they are of suspect quality. Remember the adage you get what you pay for. 0 out of 5 stars I found this one for about half the price of a new one. I use this flash on several Canon cameras, including my new mirror less R. It works beautifully and communicates with the camera perfectly. I mostly use it for birthday party type events and it works flawlessly. I got the stofen diffuser, too. The light is very natural and even. Still, even in RAW mode it cant handle all lighting conditions as it doesn't have an onboard flash. I like using flash for fill lighting especially for shooting flowers and insects. Thats where the 270ex comes in as a carry around flash. The most surprising thing was how small and light it is; it really does fit in a shirt pocket. It powers up and is ready much faster than I expected considering it just takes 2 batteries. Considering the low profile, the forward angle of the build helps to eliminate lens shadows on long lenses. Still, it isnt without some faults; it isnt the build quality of a 580ex or 430ex. Still its pretty great considering that it isnt supposed to be a replacement for a 580ex II.I didnt get a dslr until a year ago so after becoming annoyed with picture grain without the use of flash but also becoming annoyed with how harsh internal flash could be indoors I decided it was time to vouch for an external flash. When it comes to Canon, I know that people will recommend the Speedlite 580 or 470. If youre a beginner, like me, but are serious about pursuing photography then I suggest taking baby steps and starting with the more amateur products. Since I didnt know much about external flashes to begin with, I went for the 270 because I read about how simple it all was. That way within the next year or two I can upgrade to the next flash. There really is no need to go for the bigger better products if you dont know much about them. The Speedlite 270 is just the flash I needed for indoor pictures.

Ive only had it for two days and am still learning a lot about it but just within the short time Ive had it Ive really considered just how much light impacts photography. You learn how to bounce the light and begin to understand that you need walls and ceilings to bounce it off of. Things you may want to know is the longer you have it on and take pictures the more the flash itself will heat up. The batteries will become hot. I read the manual and it said if it gets too heated to turn it off for about 15 minutes. I bought AA Lithium batteries and so far I havent had to change the first pair. It doesnt swivel, just moves up at different angles. Overall, Im really glad I got it. Amazon also shipped it to me fast, even with free shipping. If youre starting out, get this flash. 0 out of 5 stars I use this on my 60D and cant begin to tell you how much more creative possibilities you can achieve utilizing the wireless capability of this flash. I would highly recommend this version over the original if you have a builtin transmitter like in the 7D, 60D, or T3i. If you like to be a minimalist and travel light, then this flash is for you. Its about the size of two decks of playing cards put together and requires only 2 AA batteries. Encloops are the best for this. One of the best things I like about Canon is actually this flash previously the original. Its light, small and still does bounce flash where you point the flash at a ceiling to redirect the light. It has manual zoom only two settings though so you don't hear the motor of the more poiwerful speedlites. But when they added remote shutter capability and wireless trigger I was sold before it even came out. What it lacked in swivel turning left to right, critical for shooting in the vertical orientation, it makes up in being able to fire off camera. That alone opens up so much more creativity place it behind the subject for a silhouette effect for example. This is the best deal under 200 bucks to venture into flash photography. After playing around with it though, there are limitations I want to point out. The remote shutter is not wireless but rather IR line of sight kind of thing, and you need to be pointing the flash towards the front of the camera for it to work. Also, its always a 2 second counter, no instant shutter release whether or not your drive mode says so. On few occassions I get no wireless connection to the flash, but once I adjust my position a few feet or so I get it back instantly. For what it is, this still works out to be a whole lot of possibilities. With the 60D, I am able to fire both my builtin flash and the 270EX II off camera at the same time, and, change the intensity ratio between the two outputs 11, 21, 18, etc. Those with the T3i can do this too.
